


Building a Strong Children's Health Workforce in Illinois

- In 2023, ILCHF issued the "SUPPORTING A STRONG CHILDREN'S HEALTH WORKFORC ILLINOIS" grant opportunity
 - Awarded 21 grants of \$20,000 each (total investment of \$420,000) to projects inspiring young people to join the children's mental and oral healthcare workforce.
- 0 applications from Northern region and only 1 application from Southwest Central

What We Learned

- Issued 817 grants to date
- Historically undersubscribed grantmaking regions
 - \circ Northern = 50 grants
 - Southwest Central = 62 grants
- Potential Issues:
 - Too late in the school year
 - Lacked examples


\$20,000 each for strategies that encourage and nurture the next generation of children's oral health and mental health providers





Youth Workforce Development 2.0 Eligibility


- Grant opportunity available to the following regions:
 - 2 grants to Southwest Central
 - 3 grants to Northern
- The goal is to provide learning opportunities and guidance to youth that will allow the exploration of potentially pursuing career paths in children's oral or mental healthcare.



Youth Workforce Development 2.0 Eligibility

 Available to nonprofit organizations that have the capacity to help children learn more about careers in children's oral or mental health

- Preference may be given to organizations:
 - Located in oral health or mental health professional healthcare workforce shortage areas
 - Go to <u>Data.HRSA.gov</u> to learn if your county is located in an oral or dental HPSA

- Organization Information
- Project Definition
- Project Narrative
- Budget, Budget Narrative, & Financial Information





Project Narrative

Please describe the need that your project will address. Be concise using sources of data (i.e., statistics/research) specific to your geographic area and proposed population. (Limit 1000 words)

Budget & Financial Information

Budget (Eligible Costs)	 Staff time to develop plans, facilitate meetings, and programs Stipends for youth, parents, caregivers, and other community partners Travel time Meeting expenses Communications expenses Materials/supplies Equipment

Award Announcement

- Grant recipients will be announced in February 2025
- Grant funds will be disbursed no later than March 1st, 2025
- Grant period will be from March 1, 2025 September 30, 2026
- Final report due on November 30, 2026
